



Legal-historical excursion in International Program

On 4th June 2016 Prof. Dr. Huck (BELS/ EIW) and scientific associate Ass. iur. Claudia Kurkin made an excursion to Wolfenbuettel, Goslar and Brunswick with exchange students of the partner universities Symbiosis Law School in Pune (India) and Murdoch University in Perth (Australia).

The program included an instructive English spoken tour through the Herzog-August Library in Wolfenbüttel where Klaus Wittchen showed us rare and illuminated manuscripts of the middle ages and the first law book in German language, the so called Sachsenspiegel from Eike von Repgow. In Goslar an US-American tour guide explained in details the Kaiserpfalz and the Old Town both belonging to the World Heritage. In Braunschweig Prof. Huck showed the students around explaining the development of the city from the 11th century until modern times. Prof. Huck added explanations on the German law showing the students the corresponding buildings of the Local, Regional and the Higher Regional Courts.

All participants appreciated the cultural historical exchange, which was mainly focused on historical and legal-historical contexts in their specific expression in architecture, language and culture. Finally all had a joint dinner in the Restaurant “Rheinische Republik” surrounded by old pictures of a time where Bonn was the capital of Germany, the perfect location to carry on talking about Germany history and culture.
