

Occupational requirements in the Lower Saxony police force – a qualitative study on the bases of motivation, collective experience social practices (German abbreviation: BerAnPo)

Project manager: Prof. Dr. Anja Mensching

Summary: The starting point for the project is to focus on the occupational

requirements and/or challenges in various areas of work of the Lower Saxony police force, and to collect these within the framework of a qualitatively-reconstructive research project, by means of both group discussions and interviews. In order to do so, the shared experiences of employees with regard to occupational requirements and their experience in occupational practice from a sociological perspective

organisation will be reconstructed, on the one hand.

On the other, the practical experience (especially collective experience) with these requirements, i.e. the strategies and practices developed in the form of tests during day-to-day work in order to meet the perceived requirements, will also be collected empirically. The data will be analysed using the

documentary method.


